Introduction

- Definition: Open Access (OA) means free online access to all peer reviewed articles that are published in scientific journals (Harnad 2005).
- Goal: maximize impact to foster progress (deposit, access, impact, progress)
- Two roads to achieve OA: Green and Golden

- Dissatisfaction re-iterated requests for bringing control "Back to Academia" (90's - Ann Okerson -Yale University)
- Satisfaction Increase Impact (90's Stevan Harnad -Scholarly Skywriting - University of Southampton)
- OAI-PMH (1999-2001 Carl Lagoze Cornell & Herbert Van de Sompel LANL)

Green Road: 94% of Journals allow selfarchival

Current Situation

Evidence: impact increase;

• OA articles are not only more cited - they are also more rapidly cited (Brody et al., 2005; Swan, 2006)

• User studies:

- >90% scholars say they publish their work to communicate their research results to pears
- 81% of scholars say they would comply to a mandate



Solutions

- Mandates (Institutional, Funding Agencies,...)
- Softwars:
 - Further user studies (not "why don't", but "why do" they self-archive?)
 - Evidence of impact (statistics, scientometric studies...)
 - Create the habit (start by distributing benefits to those who self-archive)
 - Word-of-mouth
