and Portugal?***

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Executive summary

The project Memories, cultures and identities: how the past weighs on the present-day intercultural relations in Mozambique and Portugal?, henceforth Cultures Past & Present, aimed to enrich the understanding of cultural, historical-economic and social representations in Mozambique and Portugal, through the collection, preservation and analysis of narratives conveyed by museum collections, history textbooks and cinema. Furthermore, it also sought to involve young secondary school students in activities of reflection, reinterpretation and recreation of narratives about the past and the present of intercultural relations by giving them a voice and discussing the future. The project also provided for the advanced training of researchers and the integration of senior researchers with young researchers and the community.

Within the project's scope, the team collected and analysed data, developed scientific and cultural activities and produced publications. A total of twenty-three articles were published, four indexed in the SCOPUS databases and ten in Erih Plus, Scielo, and Latindex, among others, more than 30 book chapters and thematic issues of journals such as Lusophone Journal of Cultural Studies and the Journal Vista.

Another seven books have also been published. Among them, *Portugal e Moçambique – Travessias identitárias e imaginários do passado e do presente* (2022), edited by Moisés de Lemos Martins, Alice Balbé, Isabel Macedo and Eliseu Mabasso; *Abrir os Gomos do Tempo: Conversas Sobre Cinema em Moçambique* (2022), edited by Ana Cristina Pereira and Rosa Cabecinhas; *Culturas e turismo: Reflexões sobre o património, as artes e a comunicação intercultural* (2021), edited by Moisés de Lemos Martins and Rosânia Silva; and *Áfricas: mobilidade, violência, memória e criatividade* (2021), edited by João Sarmento. The latter stems from one of the two summer schools held as part of the "Verão com Ciência" (Summer with Science) competition launched by the Fundação para a Ciência e Tecnologia (FCT) and the Direção Geral do Ensino Superior (DGES), from July to October 2020.

Within the project's scope, scientific and cultural events open to the public were organised at the university and beyond. Notably, the organization of the International Congress *Cultura e turismo: desenvolvimento nacional, promoção da paz e aproximação entre nações*, held in collaboration with the Universidade Politécnica, in Maputo, in November 2018; the *Seminário Internacional Memória, diversidade e identidades: desafios às relações interculturais no século XXI* (November 2019) and the International Conference *Artes, Culturas e Média: Comunicação intercultural e paisagens tecnológicas no espaço de língua portuguesa*, with the closure of the project (May 2022, in hybrid format) in Portugal, as well as the *II Conferência Internacional sobre Cultura & Sociedade – Que Literacia(s) para uma Justiça Económica e Social?* organised in collaboration with Zambezi University (also in hybrid format) (May 2021). Also

the organisation of the Cycle of Conferences and Round Tables "Interpelações a parte d' O Silêncio da Terra. Visualidades (pós)coloniais intercetadas pelo arquivo Diamang", at the University of Minho (between July and September 2021), in which the opening ceremony of the exhibition was attended by the Portuguese Minister of Science, Technology and Higher Education, Manuel Heitor. It also included debate sessions with the screening of films and documentaries.

The pandemic particularly affected the holding of the focus groups. Despite the constraints, the one-year extension made it possible to achieve the initially stipulated goals. These goals were achieved in quantitative terms: 24 focus groups were conducted in Mozambique, in the country's three main regions: south (Maputo province), centre (Sofala province), and north (Nampula province). In Portugal, focus groups were conducted only in the North and Centre regions. In Portugal, focus groups were conducted only in the North and Centre regions.

While the Covid-19 pandemic affected the development of activities re-launching the project's goals, on the other hand, allowed for greater outreach and diversity of participants in the project through online events. Such was the case of the *Seminário Interdisciplinar sobre Interculturalidades e consciência histórica: desafios atuais para a cidadania*, which brought hundreds of people together online (in March 2021). Worthy of note was the organisation of an unprecedented event, congregating directors, technicians, collaborators and researchers from and about African museums. Foram realizadas duas edições do *Encontro Virtual – Museus Africanos de Etnologia e Antropologia* (Junho de 2021 e junho de 2022).

1. Description of the activities

The project activities were organised into assignments within four core areas: film, textbooks, museums and collections and focus groups, as described in detail below. Furthermore, several activities were carried out jointly within the project and collaborated with other institutions and working groups, such as the Virtual Museum of Lusophony, a cultural unit of the University of Minho. It is also worth mentioning that several activities were affected due to the COVID-19 pandemic, from the organisation to the participation in scientific events and with the community, and mainly the holding of focus groups.

1.1 Sub-project - Cinema

The cinema assignment aimed to discuss the role of cinema and films in disseminating and reconstructing narratives about the past, present and future and their influence on intercultural relations between Portuguese-speaking countries, specifically between Mozambique and Portugal. In this sense, the team of researchers conducted research on the politics of memory, the dynamics of production and co-production, violence, and racism(s), among other aspects.

The researchers published scientific articles and contributed to conferences with papers, thus promoting the dissemination of knowledge and debate.

Regarding scientific publications, dozens of scientific articles were published. The book *Abrir os Gomos do Tempo: Conversas sobre cinema em Moçambique* was organised and edited by Ana Cristina Pereira (CES/UC) and Rosa Cabecinhas (CECS/UM). The book includes interviews with personalities on the history of cinema in Mozambique and is available in open access. In the book *Portugal e Moçambique – Travessias identitárias e imaginários do passado e do presente* (2022), for example, five articles address the theme of cinema. Furthermore, the project has organised the edition of the Vista Journal, no. 6, in 2020, on the theme "(In)Visibilities: image and racism". The journal is indexed in ERIH PLUS, bilingual edition and published in open access.

The project Cultures Past & Present provided the opportunity to integrate several students, mostly PhD students, into the research team at different moments of the project. In 2020, under the UMinho Scientific Research Initiation Award, the sociology student Lara Campinho developed the research "*Imagens e narrativas da interculturalidade: os jovens, o cinema e a História*". In 2022, the master's student Ana Catarina Borralho joined the team where she is developing her master's thesis in Communication, Art and Culture on Portuguese colonial cinema.

The team organised thematic panels in scientific conferences, such as the panel *(Re)building cultural memory through cinema: reception studies in Mozambique and Portugal*, presented at the 8th ECREA - European

Communication Conference, in the Section Film studies; and the panel *Políticas da memória e estratégias discursivas no cinema*, presented at the III International Conference on Activism in Africa, in September 2021.

It also held events with the community, such as film and documentary screenings. One such event was the screening of the documentary *Moçambique. Sonhos Lúcidos*, by directors João Campos and Fernando Almeida, followed by a debate mediated by researchers Sheila Khan and Rosa Cabecinhas attended by the directors at the Museu Nogueira da Silva, Braga. In Lisbon, it held a talk show with the screening of the *Enviado Especial*, attended by the director Nalini Elvino de Sousa. The talk took place after the screening of the film. It was attended by the project researchers Ana Cristina Pereira and Maria do Carmo Piçarra, who mediated the session, the researcher Maria Paula Meneses (CES/UC) and the Mozambican directors Isabel Noronha and Camilo de Sousa at the New University of Lisbon.

As part of the programme of the Cycle of Conferences and Round Tables "*Interpelações a partir d' O Silêncio da Terra. Visualidades (pós)coloniais intercetadas pelo arquivo Diamang*", the cinema team organised the session: "*Estética, política e linguagens cinematográficas*" with the screening of the films *Uma festa para viver*, by Ruy Duarte de Carvalho (1975) and *Deixem-me ao Menos Subir às Palmeiras...* (1975), by Joaquim Lopes Barbosa. The session was commented on by Ana Cristina Pereira, Kiluanje Liberdade (director, PhD student in Cultural Studies/UM), Rosa Cabecinhas and moderated by Francisco Ferreira (Lab2PT, University of Minho).

In this engagement of academia with civil society, the Cultures Past & Present project also supported the 8th edition of the Mostra Internacional Anti-Racista, a MICAR. A chapter was also published in the *Caderno Micar 2021 – Contributos de textos e ensaios visuais*, which addressed the role that cinema can play in reflecting on the past, present and future and in the anti-racism struggle. A MICAR é is the only film showcase of its kind in Portugal. The *Movimento SOS Racismo* has been promoting it in Porto since 2014.

1.2. Sub-project – School textbooks

This assignment aims at collecting and analyse the textbooks produced in Mozambique and Portugal. The research focused on history textbooks to promote reflection on intercultural relations through the analysis of contents and discourses about the national dimension of each country, representations of "us" and "the other". One of the outcomes of this journey is the publication of a proposed grid for comparative analysis of images in textbooks.

One of the biggest challenges of the assignment was the collection of material, since there is no centralised archive, especially in Mozambique after the independence, and the chronological classification of the documents. The collection of this material made it possible to build a database that currently

contains 135 textbooks, dozens of history syllabuses from INDE - *Instituto Nacional de Desenvolvimento da Educação* and documents from the *Sistema Nacional de Educação de Moçambique*. The textbooks date from 1941 to 2019, although it was not possible to identify the publication date of approximately 20 textbooks.

The COVID-19 pandemic restricted access to libraries and private collections and also restricted access to other sources of information, such as teachers, curriculum planners and Ministry of Education officials. Even so, interviews were held with the *Chefe do Departamento de Livros Escolares e Material Didáctico do Ministério da Educação e Desenvolvimento Humano de Moçambique*, Remígio Rainde; the teacher and curriculum planner at INDE, Lucas Sitoé; the former Minister of Education and current Rector of the Universidade Pedagógica de Maputo, Jorge Ferrão, and the textbook author at Texto Editora, Stella Morgadinho.

Some teachers have already made materials available, as is the case of Jan Draisma and Frouke Draisma, teachers at the Escola Secundária da Frelimo, in Bagamoyo, between 1970 and 1975 and then in Moçambique. Among the materials, these teachers provided a copy of the *Livro de História de Moçambique*, produced by Fernando Ganhão during his time as a teacher at the Instituto Moçambicano (IM) in Dar es Salaam, published in 1971 by the *Departamento de Educação e Cultura (FRELIMO)*. They also provided copies of the Secondary School Programmes/Discipline of History from grades 5 to 8 taught at the IM and then at the Escola Secundária da Frelimo in Bagamoyo.

In Portugal, interviews were conducted with Ricardo Miguel Santos, head of the International Editorial Division of Porto Editora and with Marília Gago, coauthor of textbooks by Porto Editora and Texto Editora. Marília Gago is a researcher at the Transdisciplinary Research Centre "Cultura, Espaço e Memória" at the Faculty of Arts and Humanities of the University of Porto (CITCEM-FLUP) and a lecturer at the School of Education of the University of Minho. She is also the author of the book *Consciência e Narrativa Histórico: Desafios Educativos aos Professores* (2015).

Within the scope of training opportunities, in the Second Edition of the UMinho Scientific Research Initiation Award, following the activities carried out in the first edition, the sociology student Lara Campinho developed the research "Os jovens face à História: Imagens e narrativas da interculturalidade nos manuais escolares portugueses e moçambicanos".

Also, as part of this assignment, events were organised, such as the seminar *História, Média e Educação: pesquisa-ação em Moçambique e Portugal* and the round table *Representações da Escravatura e Tráfico Negreiro nos Manuais Escolares*. The seminar was an event promoted by the project and also by the *Seminário Permanente para a Investigação e Comunidade* (SPIC) and the *Seminário Permanente de Comunicação e Diversidade*, both from the Communication and Society Research Centre. The seminar included papers by

researchers Armindo Armando, Augusto Alberto and Marlene Vanessa Jamal, PhD students in Language, Culture and Society at Zambezi University, and Alice Balbé from the Communication and Society Research Centre (CECS) at the University of Minho.

The round-table discussion on the theme *Representações da Escravatura e Tráfico Negreiro nos Manuais Escolares* took place in the context of the exhibition *Império do Medo: exposição sobre a escravatura e o tráfico negreiro*, held at the Biblioteca Lúcio Craveiro da Silva. Researchers Armindo Armando and Alice Balbé presented their work on Mozambican and Portuguese textbooks, respectively, with the participation of Jacob Lussento Cupata, who is researching Angolan textbooks. The session was moderated by Rosa Cabecinhas and attended by Moisés de Lemos Martins, the project coordinator.

Furthermore, the thematic symposium *Representações Sociais da história e relações intergrupais nos manuais portugueses*, coordinated by Rosa Cabecinhas (CECS/UMINHO) and Joaquim Valentim (UCoimbra) was also organised within the *XI Simpósio Nacional de Investigação em Psicologia*, held in Vila Real, at the University of Trás-os-Montes e Alto Douro, UTAD, in Portugal.

1.3. Sub-project - Museums and Museum Exhibitions

The assignment *Museums and Museum Exhibitions* aimed to collect, preserve and analyse the narratives conveyed by museums, more specifically, in the Museu Nacional de Nampula, in Moçambique, and the Museu Nacional de Etnologia de Portugal, in Lisboa. Along with the collection of material in these museums, two events were also organised (in 2021 and 2022) gathering African museums of ethnology and anthropology, providing new insight into the challenges faced by museums and opportunities for collaboration between researchers and the technical staff of museums, and the museums themselves.

The organisation of two summer schools involved researchers from the project team and gathered young researchers, mostly PhD students. The Summer Schools were organised through the submission of projects to the call "Summer with Science", launched by the Fundação para a Ciência e Tecnologia (FCT) and the Direção Geral do Ensino Superior (DGES) for special support to Summer Schools in Polytechnics and Universities. The two projects selected under the scope of the project are entitled: "*Áfricas: mobilidade, violência, memória e criatividade*", coordinated by researcher João Sarmento, and "*Comunicação e Cultura para o Desenvolvimento*", coordinated by researcher Lurdes Macedo. The activities were held in July, August and September 2020 and offered 25 research grants.

The Cycle of Conferences and Round Tables "*Interpelações a partir d' O Silêncio da Terra. Visualidades (pós)coloniais intercetadas pelo arquivo Diamang*", on June 25, 2020, promoted the session "*Cruzamentos: literatura, coleção e museus*". It was attended by Alda Costa (Eduardo Mondlane

University), Lurdes Macedo (Lusophone University of Porto, CECS/UM), Branca Clara das Neves (Angolan writer), José Luís Mendonça (writer and journalist) and Roberto Vecchi (University of Bologna, Italy). João Sarmento (ICS/CECS/UM) and Luís Cunha (CRIA/ICS/UM) moderated the debate. The same Cycle of Conferences and Round Tables "*Interpelações a partir d' O Silêncio da Terra. Visualidades (pós)coloniais intercetadas pelo arquivo Diamang*", promoted the session *As missões cristãs nas colónias portuguesas de África - submissão e resistência ao Colonialismo durante o Estado Novo*, on June 25, 2021. The session was attended by Friar José Nunes, Father Provincial of the Portuguese Dominicans, and Moisés de Lemos Martins (ICS/CECS/UM).

The Covid-19 pandemic raised several constraints to the assignment, especially regarding travel to the institutions and access to the institutional archives. On the other hand, the challenges imposed by the pandemic provided contact opportunities for the organisation of three international virtual meetings with less financial impact.

The first activity took place on January 28, 2021. It was attended by the project team remotely with students from the master's in Heritage and Development of Lúrio University, in Nampula, and the Director of Nampula Museum, Adriano Tepulo, joined by three other museum technicians and the researcher Alda Costa on site.

The project organised two editions of an unprecedented event. It congregated, through its Directors, African Ethnology and Anthropology museums, the first in 2021 and the second in 2022. It was also the first time the museum technicians established contact with other technicians from African museums.

The *I Encontro Virtual – Seis Museus Africanos de Etnologia e Antropologia* congregated museums from five Lusophone African countries, Angola, Cape Verde, Guinea-Bissau, Mozambique and São Tomé and Príncipe. This Virtual Meeting was attended by the Project Director, Moisés de Lemos Martins (ICS/CECS/UM), and the coordinators of the Sub-project - *Museums and Museum Exhibitions*, João Sarmento (ICS/CECS/UM) e Alda Costa (UEM/CECS). The session took place on June 15, 2020. The event had three thematic sections, the first being the "*A criação dos museus e sua evolução*", moderated by Luís Cunha (ICS-UM/CRIA), followed by the "*Desafios atuais*", moderated by Alda Costa (UEM/CECS) and the "*Projetos futuros*", moderated by Catarina Simão. The event was also attended by Samira Silva and Eugénia Alves from the Museu Etnográfico da Praia, Cabo Verde; Albano Mendes from the Museu Nacional Etnográfico da Guiné-Bissau; Álvaro Jorge from the Museu Nacional de Antropologia de Angola; from the Museu Regional da Huíla, Angola, Soraia Santos; from the Museu Nacional de São Tomé e Príncipe, Manuel Lizarda; on behalf of the Museu Nacional de Etnologia de Nampula, Moçambique, Adriano Tepulo, Adolfo Norte, Antonio Ntimbanga and Maria Pascoela Tavares.

The second edition of the *Encontro Virtual –Museus Africanos de Etnologia e Antropologia*, attended by the Project director, Moisés de Lemos Martins (ICS/CECS/UM), and the coordinators of the Sub-project - Museums and Museum Exhibitions, João Sarmento (ICS/CECS/UM) and Alda Costa (UEM/CECS), brought together directors and technicians from the museums of Angola, the Museu Nacional de Antropologia and the Museu Regional da Huíla, represented by Álvaro Jorge and Angelina Pequena, respectively; from Cabo Verde, the Museu Etnográfico da Praia, represented by Samira Silva and Eugénia Alves; from Guiné-Bissau, the Museu Etnográfico Nacional da Guiné-Bissau, represented by Albano Mendes, and from Moçambique, the Museu Nacional de Etnologia de Nampula, represented by Adriano Tepulo, Adolfo Norte, Antonio Ntimbangwa. The event comprised two thematic sections, the first on "Inventorying, cataloguing and conservation", moderated by Débora G. Merali, and the second on "Audience training and educational services", moderated by Lurdes Macedo. This session was held on June 28, 2022.

The team also published a book and also organised a themed edition of *Revista Lusófona de Estudos Culturais/Lusophone Journal of Cultural Studies*, organised by Moisés de Lemos Martins, João Sarmento & Alda Costa. This edition of the *Revista Lusófona de Estudos Culturais/Lusophone Journal of Cultural Studies* was titled "Museus, coleções e exposições, coloniais, anticolonial e pós-coloniais / Colonial, anti-colonial and post-colonial museums, collections and exhibitions" (Vol. 7, nº2 (2020)). It also promoted other events and published various articles.

The book "Áfricas. Mobilidade, violência, memória e criatividade", is among the outcomes of the Summer School. The proposal was based on four themes and objectives: understanding Africa as a continent of mobility; examining dimensions related to violence, poverty, terrorism and racism; focusing on dimensions of the construction of memory, highlighting above all dimensions such as cinema, architecture and heritage; and thinking about the process of creation, reflecting on strategies and daily lives of production and consumption, and the symbolic dimension of creating social imaginaries. The book was compiled by researcher João Sarmento and includes the participation of the Cultures Past & Present project team members and scholarship students.

The topic of the thematic issue of the *Revista Lusófona de Estudos Culturais/Lusophone Journal of Cultural Studies* was, as noted, "Colonial, anti-colonial and post-colonial museums, collections and exhibitions" (2020), 7(2). The journal has been published since 2013 in open access in the OJS system. It is bilingual and indexed in the ERIH PLUS database and SciELO. This issue, edited by the researchers Moisés de Lemos Martins, João Sarmento and Alda Costa, seeks to explore the various dimensions of museums, collections and exhibitions. In other words, when their representations, narratives and memories intersect with colonial, anti-colonial and post-colonial, retrieving, denouncing and representing subordination and legitimising social movements.

The thematic panel proposed for the IV International Conference Activisms in Africa, “Reparações históricas e a desmontagem do passado colonial” (Panel 20), coordinated by Vítor Sousa and Sheila Khan, both members of the Cultures Past & Present project and CECS, of the University of Minho, was also accepted. The Conference will be held on January 25-27, 2023, under the topic “Knowledge for transformation”, at the Faculty of Arts and Humanities of the University of Porto, in Porto, Portugal.

1.4. Sub-project - Focus Groups

The focus group assignment activities were the most affected by the Covid-19 pandemic. The schools closed in March 2020, coinciding with the result of the approval by the Ethics Committee for Research in Social Sciences and Humanities of the University of Minho (CEICSH 025/2020). Thus, appointments could only be resumed more than a year later after the reopening and approval of the schools.

In Mozambique, it was possible to resume after approval by the central supervisory bodies, namely the Maputo Provincial Directorate of Education and Human Development, the Social Services of the Council representing the State in the city of Maputo, the Sofala Provincial Directorate of Education and Human Development and the Nampula Provincial Directorate of Education and Human Development, from April 2021. In Portugal, they were resumed after the on-site classes in Secondary Education were resumed on September 2021 (according to Dispatch 6726-A/2021)¹.

Despite changes in the initial plan, which foresaw focus groups in six provinces, focus groups were held in all regions of the country (south, centre and north). As planned, 167 students participated in 24 focus groups, discussing cinema, textbooks and social representations. The Maputo province is the southern region of Mozambique; the Nampula province is the northern region, and the Sofala province is the central region. The Cabo Delgado region was excluded due to local conflicts - the region has suffered from attacks claimed by the Islamic State since 2017 - a situation that worsened in 2020.

In the province of Sofala, focus groups involving 88 students were held in schools in Beira, Búzi, Chemba, Chibabava, Gorongosa and Nhamatanda. In this province, besides the public schools, focus groups were conducted in two private schools linked to religious education, one linked to Catholic education (Nossa Senhora de Fátima School) and the other to Muslim education (Sofala Muslim Association School). In the Maputo province, the focus groups were held in schools in Matutuíne, Namaacha, and Magude. In the province of Nampula, the focus groups were held in the schools Muhala Expansão, Namicopo and Napipine. Thus in Maputo and Nampula provinces, 14 focus group sessions were held involving 79 students.

In Portugal, focus groups were held in the North and Centre region, involving 111 students. In the north, in schools in Braga and Penafiel and the Centre region in the city of Aveiro. The objective was achieved in terms of the number of groups proposed. In Portugal, 16 groups were held, divided into five sessions on the three areas: cinema, textbooks and social representations.

1.5. Social impact of the project's activities

The team has developed several scientific and cultural activities involving the academic community, artists, cultural managers and civil society in these initiatives.

One example was the organisation of two editions of the *Encontro Virtual – Museus Africanos de Etnologia e Antropologia*, an unprecedented initiative. According to the participants, congregating representatives of the museums made it possible to understand common challenges, learn about other museums' initiatives, develop inside and outside the physical structures of the museums, and establish future research networks in this area.

As part of the programme of the Cycle of Conferences and Round Tables "*Interpelações a partir d' O Silêncio da Terra. Visualidades (pós)coloniais intercetadas pelo arquivo Diamang*". The activity promoted debates, film screenings and exhibitions at the Galeria do Paço of the University of Minho and the Museum Nogueira da Silva in Braga. It also held, in partnership with the Biblioteca Lúcio Craveiro da Silva, a thematic panel discussion: "*Representações da Escravatura e Tráfico Negreiro nos Manuais Escolares*". The session was organised as part of the exhibition "*Império do Medo: exposição sobre a escravatura e o tráfico negreiro*".

The Cultures Past & Present project also sponsored the *8th edition of the Mostra Internacional Anti-Racista*, promoted by SOS Racismo in Porto, Portugal. Moreover, the documentary on *Moçambique – Sonhos Lúcidos*, by directors João Campos and Fernando Almeida, was screened in Braga, and the film *Enviado Especial*, by director Nalini Elvino de Sousa, was screened in Lisbon, promoting debate with the public.

1.6. Advanced training

The Cultures Past & Present project has enabled the advanced training of researchers, which is also worth highlighting. There are currently six PhD students in the project research team and one master's student. One undergraduate student also participated in the project's activities through an initiative to Initiate Scientific Research promoted by UMinho.

The researchers are currently completing their PhDs in the scope of the Cultures Past & Present project. Cassimo Jamal is currently teaching at Licungo

University in Mozambique. Ana Cristina Pereira, a researcher at the University of Coimbra, is also a guest lecturer at Universidade Lusófona in Portugal.

Both students have Professor Rosa Cabecinhas as their supervisor at the University of Minho and collaborate on the textbook and cinema assignments, respectively, and the focus group assignment.

Marlene Jamal is developing her PhD thesis on “*Educação Social de Rua como Mudança Paradigmática em Moçambique: estudo de caso das Crianças de e na Rua da Cidade de Quelimane*”. She collaborates on textbooks and focus groups in Mozambique. Manuela Pery is developing a PhD thesis on “*Experimento prático de comunicação para a mudança social e de*

comportamento na cidade da Beira". Both students have Professor Moisés de Lemos Martins as supervisor at the University of Minho.

Two other PhD students are also collaborating on the project. Researcher Luís Camanho, from the School of Fine Arts of the University of Porto, develops research on photography and the history of athletics in Portugal and collaborates in the project's activities in cinema and school textbooks. He was a research scholarship holder of the project and assisted in implementing focus groups.

The researcher Tânia Madureira is developing her PhD thesis in Anthropology, at ISCTE-Instituto Universitário de Lisboa, about the history of the Museu Nacional de Etnologia de Moçambique and the role of museums in the representation of Mozambican national identity.

She collaborates on the museums and exhibitions assignment and has worked directly with the researcher Alda Costa.

As part of the UMinho Scientific Initiation Award, the project opened the opportunity for students from the Institute of Social Sciences of the University of Minho to participate in research projects. In both editions of this award, the project relied on a student of the Sociology degree, Lara Campinho, to develop activities in the areas of cinema and textbooks in close collaboration with the team. This initiative has thus provided research experience to young researchers.

Ana Catarina Borralho, a master's student in Communication, Art and Culture, is also part of the research team. The student is developing a master's dissertation on "*Memória e Imaginário no Cinema Colonial Português*" under the supervision of Professor Moisés de Lemos Martins and is part of the cinema assignment team. The dissertation is expected to be submitted until October 31, 2022.

2. Publications

The project results have been published with the explicit acknowledgement of funding in 23 scientific articles, national and international journals, Portuguese, English and French, seven book organisations, and 32 published book chapters.

The team members' articles published in scientific journals underwent peer review and were indexed in several scientific databases. Among them, four articles were published in journals indexed in SCOPUS and 10 in journals indexed in ERIH PLUS (European Reference Index for the Humanities and Social Sciences). Most of the articles were published in open access. Although the publications are still recent, we can already identify more than 20 citations of articles produced within the project, according to Google Scholar. Furthermore, there are also publications in journals indexed in EBSCOhost, SciELO, Web of Science, Science Direct, Reviscom, CEDAL (Documentation Centre for Latin America), DOAJ (Directory of Open Access Journal) and in directories such as Latindex and Redalyc.

The *Vista Journal*, published by the Communication and Society Research Centre and the Portuguese Association of Communication Sciences (SOPCOM),

organised five journal issues within the project's scope. As for the *Revista Lusófona de Estudos Culturais/Lusophone Journal of Cultural Studies* (RLEC), it is a bilingual publication (Portuguese/English), which promotes the relevance of the Portuguese language as a language of science and increases the reach of the publications.

5. Deviations from the proposed work programme

Cultures Past & Present research project underwent some constraints during its execution. The empirical assignments were the most affected, namely the focus groups, which were not held according to the initially planned schedule, mainly due to the Covid-19 pandemic. The extension of the project by one year allowed the team to attain all the major goals proposed in the application, and focus groups were held in 2022.

Regarding human resources, the grantees started activities in April 2019. A few months later, a grantee (master) requested leave for personal reasons in Mozambique. In December of the same year, a grantee (master) also requested leave to receive an individual research grant as part of a PhD in Portugal. A new contract was signed in Portugal, for 12 months, between March 2020 and March 2021. In Mozambique, the new contract was only made in 2021 for six months. The changes were communicated to the FCT. The budget for the acquisition of services and materials also had to be altered (with FCT approval) to allocate funds to maintain the contract of the post-doctoral fellow in Portugal until December 2021.

The organisation of conferences and participation in scientific events and events for society were naturally affected by the Covid-19 pandemic. For example, in Mozambique, the organisation of the *II Conferência Internacional sobre Cultura e Sociedade – que literacia(s) para a justiça económica e social?*, in partnership with the Centro Humanidades FCSH-Universidade Nova de Lisboa and the Universidade Zambeze, was held online (in May 2021).

The team's participation in major international events, such as *ECREA – 8th European Communication Conference* and in the *III International Conference Activisms in Africa*, can only proceed online. In both cases, the team members were coordinating thematic panels. The *Seminário Interdisciplinar Interculturalidades e consciência histórica: desafios atuais para a cidadania*, had to be postponed by one year. Due to sanitary conditions, the seminar had to be held online. The project's closing event, *Conferência Internacional Artes, Culturas e Média: Comunicação intercultural e paisagens tecnológicas no espaço da língua portuguesa* had to be held in hybrid format.
